Thank you for joining in with Testudo, you are now one of a growing number of people committed to praying regularly for our churches, on set days – so you can know that you are not praying alone, even when there is no one with you!

This booklet contains a simple set order of prayers for each day of the week. The first question to answer is, "Which days do I want to commit to praying on?" Once you have decided on anywhere between I and 7 days, you are invited to circle those days on the front of this booklet, as a way of personally registering your commitment, and to act as a visual reminder. It would be good if you could also send your name and your days to The Revd. Paul Harford (01765 677123, revpaulharford@gmail.com), so he can share the information with other Testudo! members, so we all know who to pray for!

How to use this booklet

On each day, you will be guided through a simple pattern of prayer, with a suggested short Bible reading to reflect upon (alternatively, if you already use Bible Study notes, you might like to use Testudo prayer around them).

You will notice that some parts are in bold, and marked as **All:**. This is in case people are using Testudo in groups of 2 or more; however, if you are praying by yourself just read it all – you may also appreciate the gentle reminder throughout that despite being by yourself, you are still praying with others **all:** of whom will be saying those words today!

You will see there is space each day for your own prayers, with suggestions of what to pray for. You are invited to use this space however best suits you, either freely extemporising, or using a set pattern you are already familiar with, or these:

A Prayer for Testudo members

Father, I pray today for those who are praying with me, and for me. Pour out your spirit upon [names] this day, that they may know your presence. Grant them courage, confidence, and opportunity to share the love they have in you with others; and bring all their good works this day to completion.

A Prayer for our Churches

God of mission, who alone brings growth to your Church, send your Holy Spirit to give vision to our planning, wisdom to our actions, and power to our witness. Help our church to grow in numbers, in spiritual commitment to you, and in service to our local community, through Christ our Lord.

A Prayer for those in need

Father, I pray today for those who are suffering in body, mind, or spirit. [In particular today we pray for...] Pour out your healing Spirit upon them, and those who support them and care for them. May they know the strength of your presence. Grant them the abundance of life that is your promise in Christ Jesus.
